The President's Page

As we prepare for the upcoming 2018 sailing season, I would like to recap the progress that was made in 2017 and share some of the changes that are in store for the coming season.

In 2017, GMORA launched an Education Series held in both Casco Bay and Pen Bay to help less-experienced racers gain knowledge and confidence in their ability to join and compete in the racing community. In Casco Bay we saw a 63% increase in the number of cruising boats participating in the June events over the previous year, and I think this can be directly attributed to these classes. Going forward, we plan to continue to offer various classes every spring in Casco Bay and stream them live on Facebook so they'll be available to sailors around the state. A big thank-you goes out to Lauryn Smith for organizing these classes.



2017 also saw GMORA institute a new Grant-Sponsorship Program aimed to help Organizing Authorities obtain the equipment and advertising needed to run better events. This new program was a great success, with \$2,500 being given to seven different organizations around the state, and is planned to be offered again in 2018.

This season we are welcoming several new events to the Gulf of Maine Ocean Racing Circuit (GMORC). In Casco Bay, the Portland Yacht Club will host the Richmond Island Race. The Boothbay Region will finish the Downeast Challenge — an overnight race from Marblehead, Mass., hosted by Marblehead Yacht Club — and Boothbay Harbor Yacht Club's J/80 East Coast Championship. Pen Bay will host Rockland Yacht Club's Windward-Leeward Challenge, Lyman-Morse's Camden Classics Cup, Northport Yacht Club's John Short Series, and Front Street Shipyard's PHRF-ME Regatta. A new Organizing Authority - Stockton Springs Sailing Center – will host the Turtle Head Trot Regatta. We would also like to welcome back the East Region's Northeast Harbor Fleet and add their Great Harbor Dream Pursuit Race and the Max Warburg Trophy to the circuit. Scoring will only be changed slightly; combining Divisions 2 and 3 to reflect how most Organizing Authorities are setting class breaks for their events.

To close out the year, the Annual GMORA Awards Banquet in 2018 will be split into three banquets, one for each scored region. The hope is that this will encourage more people to attend if the event is closer to them and to welcome PHRF weeknight racers to mingle and see what GMORA is about.

As many of you are aware, this past fall I lost my father, local sailor Butch Minson. His life passion was sailing, and introducing new people to the sport by coaching, teaching classes and mentoring many at post-race parties. In moving forward with organizing GMORA, and promoting sailing, I find myself asking what Butch would have recommended on many issues at hand. With that in mind, I would like to challenge everyone to help promote racing, with his spirit as a reminder of why we all enjoy this sport so much.

Mission Statement

Scoring, Tropies, and Conditions of Eligibility

1. Eligibility

Each boat with a valid PHRF-NE or NEMA certificate whose owner is a current GMORA regular member in good standing shall be considered eligible for scoring.

2. Race Day

A Race Day is one day of racing, whether one or more races are conducted. A competitor must compete in all races conducted on a day for that Race Day to be eligible to be scored. If a boat scores DNC in any race, that day will not be scored as a Race Day. Certain long-distance races are scored as two Race Days; see the Racing Schedule.

3. Scoring System

Race Day performance of a yacht will be scored by GMORA using the CHIPS 3 scoring system, which weighs results by reference to the number of competitors in a particular division. So, for example, a first place in a division of 12 competitors will yield a higher score than a first place in a division of five competitors.

4. Division Breaks

For GMORA scoring PHRF-NE Racing Division breaks will be:

Division 1 – up to 93

Division 2 – 94 to 192

Division 3 – 193 and up

Cruising Class yachts shall be scored in one division.

Multihull Class yachts shall be scored in one division.

Shorthanded Class yachts shall be scored in one division.

J/80 Class yachts shall be scored in one division.

Member clubs are encouraged to use the same breaks where feasible.

5. Scoring

A. A Racing Class yacht shall be scored in her GMORA division irrespective of the division in which she races in any specific regatta. As an example: if a yacht has a Racing rating that places her in GMORA Racing Division 2 but the Race Committee places that boat in Racing Division 1 (for any reason) she shall earn points for each boat beaten that day and those points shall be applied to her GMORA score against her Division 2 season competition.

B. Racing, Cruising, Multihull and Shorthanded Classes shall be scored separately. Yachts that score a Race Day in one class shall not apply that score to any other class.

C. Standings for the day are determined by the low-point scoring system, which is described in the Racing Rules. A yacht that is present and accounted for in the starting area but does not start a race will be scored DNS for that race, will be considered to have competed, and will be scored accordingly with a Low Point score of 1 plus the

number of yachts. CHIPS 3 points for the day are awarded based on the resulting standings.

6. Race Committee Support

The purpose is to encourage yacht owners to support Race Committees by awarding GMORA points for Race Committee participation in GMORA-scored events. GMORA points will be awarded to a yacht whose owner provides support for a Race Committee. The following rules apply:

1. Points will be awarded for at most two race days per season.
2. The owner must serve on the Race Committee for all races in each of the one or two race days.
3. To qualify for an award, a yacht must still race the required minimum number of race days.
4. Race Committee points will be calculated as follows: Take the trophy-qualifying scores after throw-outs, drop the lowest one or two scores (depending on the number of days supporting the Race Committee in that region) and replace them with the average of the trophy-qualifying scores.
5. This calculation will apply to the Region, the Overall, and the Dirigo Bowl trophies. This will not apply to the Watson Trophy, the Ocean Planet Trophy, or other such special awards.

7. Awards

Awards are based on the Chips 3 scoring table (also known as high-point percentage scoring). With Chips 3 scoring a vessel that wins in a larger fleet is rewarded more handsomely as compared to a vessel that wins in a smaller fleet (refer to the chips 3 chart).

Regional Awards

Trophies will be awarded to eligible yachts in each of the three (3) GMORA Racing Divisions, the Cruising Division and J/80 Class. Second and subsequent place trophies will be awarded if participation in the division is sufficient.

Western, Boothbay, PenBay Region

To be eligible, a yacht must race four (4) Race Days in races designated for the specific region in the Race Schedule. Best four (4) Race Days in a region count. Race Days must be from at least two different organizing authorities and at least four separate events. A yacht can be eligible for trophies in multiple regions if they meet the above requirements

Gulf of Maine Overall Championships

To be eligible, a yacht must race seven (7) Race Days, best seven (7) Race Days count and must be in events

that are hosted in at least two (2) different Geographic Areas; see the Racing Schedule.

As an example, if a vessel sailed seven (7) Race Days in the Western Geographic Area, she would still have to compete in at least one (1) Race Day in another Geographic Area to qualify.

Multihull Circuit Championship

To be eligible, a multihull yacht must race four (4) Race Days in any GMORA sanctioned region. Best four (4) race days count.

Shorthanded Circuit Championship

GMORA will score a shorthanded circuit championship. To qualify for the shorthanded circuit championship, a yacht must race at least three (3) qualifying Race Days, including at least one race 65 nautical miles or longer; and, must race all qualifying races with a crew of, at most, two (2). The best three (3) days count. At least one race 65 nautical miles or longer must be counted.

A yacht that races shorthanded in a normally crewed division also earns points for that race in that crewed division. A yacht may race with crew on some race days, and shorthanded on others, but not within the same regatta.

A qualifying race day is defined as follows:

- a. If there is a shorthanded class, the yacht must race in that class, except as set forth below. The yacht would be scored against that class.
- b. If there is a single-handed class, but no double-handed class, then a double-handed boat may race in the crewed division in which she would normally race with a spinnaker. The single-handed yachts would be scored against the other single-handed yachts, and the double-handed yachts would be scored against the crewed boat.
- c. If there is no shorthanded class, then a shorthanded boat may race the crewed division in which she would normally race with a spinnaker. The yacht would be scored against the class in which she races.

If a regatta offers more than one shorthanded class for

boats flying spinnakers, then yachts shall race in their respective assigned classes, and earn points against those classes. Multihull yachts that meet these requirements are considered eligible. Cruising Class boats are not eligible.

J/80 Circuit Championship

To be eligible a yacht must race at least six (6) Race Days designated as Fleet J/80 (see race schedule). Best six (6) days count. Race days must be from at least four separate events.

A skipper must inform the regatta chair at the official regatta check in that the race day(s) should be scored toward the J/80 Class (a class within a class), a boat may keep points earned for both classes.

Perpetual Trophies

Dirigo Bowl, Gulf of Maine Championship

1. The winner shall be the yacht among the first-place winners of the five (5) Divisions in the Overall Region that attains the highest score for the best seven (7) Race Days.

Arthur K. Watson Memorial Trophy

1. Awarded to the yacht that participates in the most GMORA sanctioned Events. In the event of a tie the trophy will be awarded to the yacht that has the highest cumulative Race Day CHIPS 3 points.
2. There is no distinction granted to specific division participation. Yachts in all divisions, both Racing and Cruising, are eligible.
3. Eligibility is recognized even when a yacht participates in more than one division. Yacht scores from all divisions will be added together to be cumulative.
4. Events are Series recognized and sanctioned by GMORA.

Ocean Planet Shorthanded Racing Trophy

1. Awarded to the first-place winner of the Shorthanded Circuit Championship.

GMORA Awards Banquet 2017 Wrap-Up

On Saturday, Oct. 21, the 2017 GMORA awards party was held at the Taste of Maine restaurant, in Woolwich.

A total of 38 awards were presented, recognizing sailors from Casco Bay, Boothbay and Penobscot Bay for their achievements on the water during the 2017 racing season.

The prestigious **Dirigo Bowl** for 2017 was awarded to Kenneth Weg and the crew of *Ranger*, a Morris 42x, for being the boat with the best score from seven races with at least one from outside their home region. In 2017, *Ranger* had a strong showing in races from all three regions to bring the Dirigo Bowl back to Northeast Harbor Fleet for the first time in many years.

The following special awards were also presented:

"Most Improved" went to the folks aboard *Polaris* for after a great racing season that included a broken tiller as they rounded the windward mark.

"Most Valuable Crew" went to the husband and wife team of Tom and Dorrie Higbee aboard *Althea*, who celebrated

their 21st anniversary the night of the banquet.

"Cleanest Bottom" went to the team aboard *Tamarack* for having a super-motivated crewmember who went above and beyond by leaving the boat for a quick swim to check the bottom as the boat headed to the starting line.

"Best Named Boat" went to *Prom Dress* because . . . it was named *Prom Dress*.

The **"Broken Boat"** award went to the

folks aboard *Canis Minor* for the most creative act of destruction that led to the spousal authorization for a new race boat with a PHRF rating drop of 93 points!

Joe Burke, the publisher of *Points East* magazine, was on hand to present the GMORA Yachtsman of the Year award to Peter McCrea in recognition for his contribution to the sport.

GMORA Yachtsman of the Year, 2017: Peter McCrea

Editor's note: Each year the Gulf of Maine Ocean Racing Association (GMORA), in association with Points East (PE), presents the Yachtsman of the Year Award to a Maine sailor who has in some way distinguished him/herself. The following is a transcript of PE Publisher Joe Burke's award speech, which was delivered at the GMORA awards banquet Oct. 21 in Woolwich, Maine.

This has been a competitive year for this award, with nine people nominated, all of them strong candidates. The winner, selected by the previous recipients of this award, is certainly a standout sailor. He is both a racer and a cruiser, and he's been at it for over 30 years. His sailing CV includes the entire U.S. East Coast, from Maine to Key West, Bermuda many times, an Atlantic Circle, the eastern Caribbean, the Bahamas and Nova Scotia.

What makes all of this even more remarkable is that much of it was accomplished singlehanded or doublehanded. And in a 32-foot boat. Those Bermuda trips? He's done 13 Bermuda 1-2's. (Actually, the most recent one was a 1-1; he did both legs solo.) That Atlantic Circle? It was accomplished doublehanded with his remarkable wife as crew.

Among the countless races in which this year's winner has competed, dozens of them have been Maine ocean races in the shorthanded division. They include the Downeast Challenge, the Gulf of Maine Solo-Twin, the Maine Rocks Race, the Round Islesboro Race, the Rockland-Castine Race . . . well you get the idea. In total, our recipient has logged over 74,000 sea miles in his Freedom 32 *Panacea*.

But to earn this award, a sailor must

be considered not just good in his own right, but also a good ambassador of the sport. Let me quote from his nomination papers: "He has seduced many Maine sailors into doing many singlehanded offshore races. Thanks to his energy and enthusiasm, singlehanded and double-handed classes have been added to most of the GMORA races. More importantly than his own participation, he has mentored many of us as we have made the transition to single or short-handed offshore racing."

This is not the first time our recipient has been recognized for his sailing accomplishments. He was the very first person awarded the Ocean Cruising Club's (OCC's) Vertue Award. Besides being an OCC member, he is also Port Captain in Rockland/Thomaston, and is an

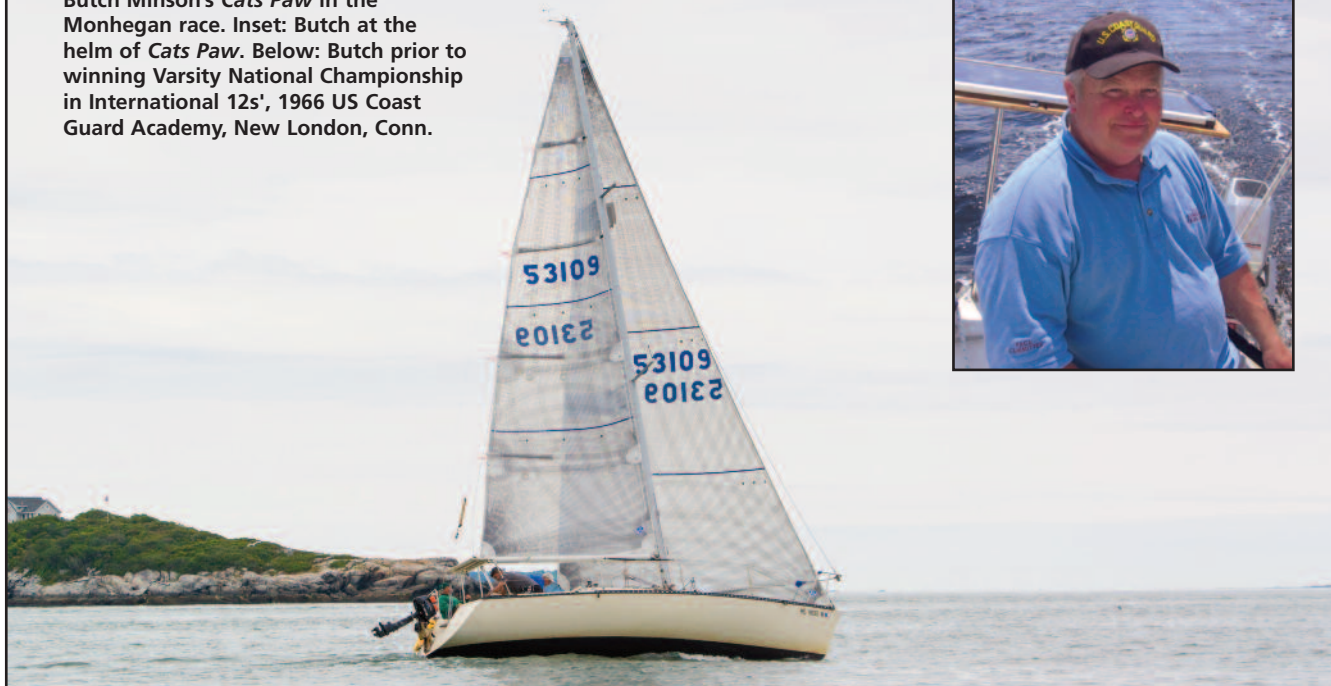

In Memoriam:

Frederick "Butch" Vernon Minson 1946 - 2017

Frederick "Butch" Vernon Minson, 71, passed away at his home Oct. 30, 2017. Butch attended the Coast Guard Academy, graduating in 1968. He led the Coast Guard Academy Sailing Team as a team captain and, in 1966, Butch led the team to win the Collegiate Varsity National Sailing Championship. In 1968, he won the college Single-handed National Sailing Championship. Butch was a two-time All-American, including being among the elite group chosen the very first year they added that designation to the sport. He also placed 2nd at the U.S. Olympic trials to represent the United States in sailing. He served in the Coast Guard for 21 years, retiring as a commander. Butch always said sailing wasn't a hobby or a sport, but a lifelong addiction. Following retirement, Butch coached the Maine Maritime Academy (MMA) Sailing Team for 14 years.



From Eric Jergenson, MMA Sailing Team alum, and former MMA Sailing Master:

I am sorry to share that Coach Butch Minson passed away on Oct. 30. He was a master of both the art and science of sailing, and enthusiastically shared this love with everyone he met. Most of all, Coach Minson was a gentleman and a true sportsman. I speak for many when I say he helped me become a better sailor. And, more importantly, a better person. Thank-you Coach Minson for making an investment in all your sailors. The day you passed on was a challenging day on the water in Maine, with hurricane-force wind gusts. It was also a fitting tribute to the man who could see the wind and always seemed to make the best of even the tiniest cat's paw upon the water.

Coach, after the storm on Oct. 30 I saw *Catspaw*, your Lindenberg 28, resting safely on her mooring. I didn't know yet that you had started your greatest voyage. But I was so thankful your boat was safe. We will still have her as a reminder of you. I am confident you now have the perfect vessel. All of *Catspaw's* positive attributes (but her keel is 3" forward, and the new bulkheads are lighter), but with no maintenance and a perfectly wet-sanded bottom. I am sure you are impressed with the cut of your new #1.

We are going to miss you, Coach. I'm going to miss you. But as each one of us passes over to that infinite possibility, I know you'll be waiting. Waiting, and looking for crew.

Thank you, Coach. We have the watch now.

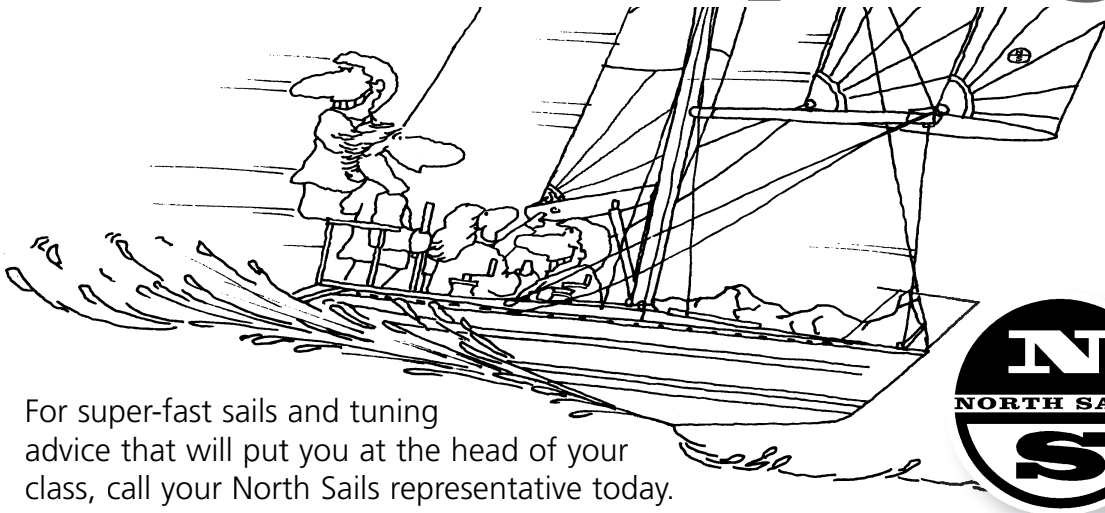

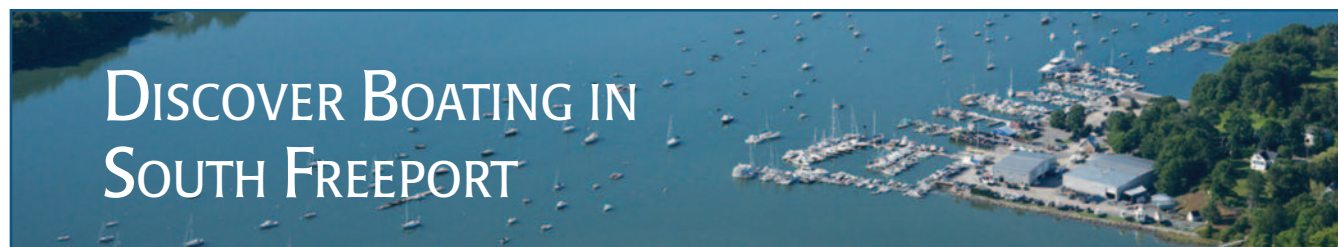



Some Snapshots from GMORA's 45-Year History

Following are some highlights in GMORA history, compiled from information dug up from various offices, filing cabinets, and certain participants' remarkable memories. Anyone who can fill in any blanks is encouraged to send information to info@gmora.org. To save space, we are presenting every 4th year looking back from the most recent.

1973: The Pilot Race, Whaleback Race Div I and II, Monhegan Race IOR, Monhegan Race (New England Racing Rule), Manana Race, and Boon Island Race composed the series. A yacht needed to participate in at least three races to be eligible for a trophy. Thirty-eight boats were entered in the circuit, 21 received final point standings. The U.S. Coast Guard Academy's *Capet* took 1st overall.

1977: Twenty-one boats qualified for final scoring. Merle Hallett's *Scaramouche* was 1st in IOR A, J. and Dave Corson's *Rub-a-Dub-Dub* won IOR B, Abbott Fletcher's *Majek* won the NERR division, and Payson Adams *Pointin Star* was tops in MORC

1981: The series was best of six races, including at least one overnight, and 31 boats qualified for final scoring. Winners were Fred Leighton's *Cadre* in IOR, Del Damboise's *Barbara* in PHRF, and Jim Stanley's *Capella* in the J/24 class.

1985: Thirty-five yachts qualified for final scoring. Winners in their divisions were: PHRF A: *Airwaves*, Turner Porter; PHRF B: *Scaramouche*, Merle Hallett; PHRF C: *Majek*, Abbott Fletcher; PHRF D: *Java*, D. Johansen; MHS: *Capella*, Jim Stanley.

1989: Again, more than 40 boats were in the running for season points. Winners were Bill Reynolds' *Matriarch* in PHRF A, Geoff Emanuel's *Aberration* in PHRF B, Bob Twinem's *Jackpot* in PHRF C, and L. Nash's *Williwaw* in PHRF D. Doyle Marchant's *Revolution V* won the IMS division.

1993: Maine Maritime Academy had a 1-2 finish in PHRF A with *Madcap* taking 1st and *Maritime Express* taking 2nd. Gary Blenkhorn's *Illusion* and Bob Kellogg's *Tamarack* take

1st in PHRF B and C respectively. *Avatar*, skippered by Alan Kew, wins Cruising Class. David Boas of *Madcap* wins the Dirigo Bowl, which recognizes the overall champion who gets the most points in its nine best races days, while racing at least two days outside its home area.

1997: Hospice Regatta of Maine is launched and included in the GMORA schedule. Bob Johnstone in *Gannett* wins PHRF A; the Altercation Syndicate wins PHRF B in *Altercation*, Ted McCarthy takes 1st in PHRF C in *Equinox*, Chris Robinson wins Cruising Class in *Houqua*, and Peter Garcia's *Alegria* wins the Multihull Series.

2001: Dick Hale and the crew of *Bandito* are again triumphant in PHRF A. The Maine Maritime Academy's *Madcap* wins PHRF B, and Richard Hallett's *Family Wagon* ends the season at the top of PHRF C. *Madcap* wins the Dirigo Bowl.

2005: Sash Spencer's *Whiplash* wins PHRF A, Ned Semonite's *Black Owl* takes PHRF B/J105, Geoff Emanuel wins PHRF C in *Commotion*, Mark Werner's *Nipantuck* wins Cruising Class, and *Faamu Saami* was tops for Multihulls. *Nipantuck*'s Mark Werner wins the Dirigo Bowl.

2009: GMORA teamed up with SailMaine to launch the first annual SailMaine Regatta. Funds raised through entry fees and product sales benefited the SailMaine community sailing program in Portland, which offers sailing instruction and coaching to youth, high-school teams, and adults. Pete Price's *Big Dog Party* won Division 1; Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* took first in Division 2; *Tamarack*, skippered by Bob Kellogg, took top honors overall in Division 3; *Pit Party*, co-captained by Rich Ketchum and Steve Fernald, was 1st overall in Division 4; Randy Rice's *Rita P* took 1st overall for Cruising Class. Scott Smithwick and *Kaos* scored a repeat, winning the Dirigo Bowl for the second straight year.


2013: Scott Smithwick and crew on board *Kaos* once again schooled the fleet taking home the Dirigo Bowl, for the fifth time in six years, but not without some drama in September. At the end of

August, *Kaos* lead *Keemah* for the overall by 11.1 points, and proceeded to extend her lead after the first Fall Series race. However, the next week, in the Lightship Race, *Keemah* beat *Kaos* to cut into *Kaos*' lead, but not by enough. The die was cast.

Overall division winners were Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* in Division 2 and Butch Minson's *Cats Paw* in Division 3. There were no overall winners in Divisions 1, 4 or Cruising. Scott Miller's *Resolute* won the *Ocean Planet* Shorthanded Trophy.

2017: An almost entirely new executive board was elected, comprised of sailors

from the next generation. The number of Race Days was reduced to 4 for regional trophies and 7 for the Dirigo Bowl to encourage more participation. An Educational Series was created by Lauryn Smith and taught by Butch Minson, with nine classes held between Centerboard Yacht Club and Front Street Shipyard, teaching the basics of sail trim, tactics and racing rules. Cruising Class in Casco Bay saw tremendous double-digit gains in participation, the kind not seen in recent history. The Dirigo Bowl was won by Kenneth Weg and the crew of *Ranger*.

The Approach of a New Sailor

It only took me a few times being out on a sailing charter in Casco Bay to start dreaming about being out on the water as much as possible. Yet, I didn't grow up sailing, didn't know the difference between port and starboard at the time, and most advice given to me in my life had been, "the best boat is a friend's boat." So, at first, making my dream a reality seemed like an incredibly unreasonable feat.

But, I was committed. I committed to learning the basic terminology (accepting it may take a lifetime to learn all of it), studying the points of sail, and taking every opportunity to experience sailing with different skippers and crews. It turns out investing in a pair of boat shoes wasn't entirely necessary, although it provided me with a little more confidence starting something new with such little experience. Surprisingly, I found the Maine sailing community to be extremely inviting. It was like, "Hey, you like adventure? I like adventure. Let's go sailing!"

Yet, disparate invitations for social sails were not getting me out on the water as much as I'd wanted. Plus, I started to want to be more than a passenger and learn good sail trim, navigation, and have the experience of hoisting a spinnaker (at least once). I was intrigued to get involved in sailboat racing. Racing offers sailors at all skill levels adventures while also offering the challenges that build individual aptitudes and strengthen communication. The sunsets, meals, entertainment, and

socializing are all a great bonus! And, if you have the time, it's possible to sail Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and all weekend for most weeks of the summer!

Reflecting on my first summer of racing, it's difficult to remember how I got on so many boats. But, here are a few tips as I encourage you to get involved:

Get Out in the Community

GMORA, *Points East* magazine, Sail Maine, The Apprentice Shop, Portland Yacht Services, and many local yacht clubs all host social, networking, crew-match and educational events that are open to everyone. Trust that the community is excited to have more people involved and attend these.

If you were not able to attend events (or miss getting involved early in the season when the events happen), I'd encourage you to join yacht clubs as a social member (where you can volunteer at regattas) or post your interest on the notice boards at clubs, marinas, and local boating stores. *Points East* website hosts a crew match page (www.pointseast.com/crewmatchsubmit/). Also, SailMaine has social sails you can participate in throughout the season. And, the South Portland Sailing Center is a fantastic resource to get out on the water and into the community.

Ask Questions

Sailors love talking about sailing. I've found if you have

questions, they typically don't mind answering them, especially if you have potential to be a committed member of their crew in the future. And, even if you're talking to someone who doesn't need crew, they likely know someone who does.

Be Accountable

When captains select their crew, it's critical that the crew is prepared and present at go time. If you are invited to join a crew, take the responsibility seriously and show up. Don't leave your skipper short-handed for the race. And, when you're assigned a role, make sure you understand what's expected before the race clock begins.

Be Humble

Listen more. Talk less. Respect that if you're new to the crew or the entire crew is new, your skipper is doing their best to direct the crew to work together and be competitive. Your job as a crewmember is to execute the captain's sail plan and do the jobs you've accepted or are assigned. Some skippers speak clearly and some may yell their commands. For this reason, it may be best to commit to the races that are shorter in length until you learn a skipper's style and how you feel about it. Sometimes, it's about getting out of the way fast enough for an experienced crewmember to get involved. That's ok, too.

Pack Appropriately

As a general rule, I'd say show up fed and don't bring anything but your body (and maybe a bottle of water and your own PFD, if you have one) to J/Boat, Etchells and weekend regatta

events. These events are the most competitive, and I've found that the skippers may be concerned about any extra pound of weight you contribute. I've also found that skippers of longer regattas own the responsibility of feeding their crews and making sure you have tickets to the post-event buffets.

Meanwhile, if you're in a PHRF race or anything that goes by the name "beer can," make sure you know the skipper's pick of poison and offer to bring some with you — the "snacktician" is always a great beginner position during cruising races.

As a legend who could recite most of the rules from memory, took the race very seriously, and would often win, it meant a lot to know how much he cared about the crew's experience. Let us all take away that we race in these communities for pleasure. And, in addition to being on the water, watching the summer's sun setting, and developing skills that improve your whole self, there's often a celebration somewhere after docking to extend the fun. At Centerboard Yacht Club, each crew hosts a meal, at Portland Yacht Club they have BBQ dinners post-race and live local music on Thursdays for a small cost, and each regatta has their own separate events of which your skipper will likely know the details.

Casco Bay's largest one-design fleet (third largest in the U.S.) looks forward to the 2018 season. We cap our sailing season with a year-end regatta - the Lobster Bowl (now an international event), which this year will be held Sept. 22-23. The Lobster Bowl draws up to 30 boats from as far away as Florida and Canada. During weekend races such as the MS Regatta, the Etchells fleet often has its own start.

The Etchells is an elegant 30-foot keelboat with non-overlapping jib and spinnaker and lots of strings to pull. Sailed competitively by a crew of three or four, they are easy to sail in light or

The J/24 Fleet 43 was formed in the great room of the Portland Yacht Club in Falmouth, Maine, in 1980 and is going strong to this day. That first summer there were close to 25 boats on the starting line. This is impressive since Rodney Johnstone had designed the boat in his garage a mere five years earlier. Johnstone hoped to create a boat that could be competitive in offshore racing, but would also be a relatively inexpensive way to get a family out on the water for overnights.

Today there are over 5,000 J/24s worldwide, and here in Maine, Fleet 43 is one of the strongest J/24 fleets in the country. Up to 15 boats routinely start our Wednesday Night Series that runs from May to September. We annually host the Downeast Regatta, one of the most popular J/24 regattas in the country (the first weekend after Labor Day), and regularly get at least 25 boats. We have hosted a North American championship for 49 teams from across North America. This year, the Downeast Regatta will be the J/24 National Championship and will have 50 boats competing in the event. There are currently 37 boats registered.

The J/24 sails with 4-6 people and the crew should have a combined weight of less than 882 lbs. In our fleet, each team

acts as race committee once during the summer and an award is given to the team that does it best. We start racing between 5:30-6:00 p.m., depending upon what time the sun sets, and generally start two or three races that are 45- to 60-minutes long. The sailors join together at PYC afterwards for drinks, and that evening's race committee brings fun snacks to share as we recount the evening's achievements, blunders, and what the wind did or didn't do for us. Sometimes we play video from the evening and share photos.

Molly White, the heart of Fleet 43 and current Vice President of the J/24 National Class says about us, "We have a strong balance of both genders and our fleet is an inviting one for women, men, and kids of all ages – from junior sailors to kids who are in their 60s and 70s. We are a fun-loving close-knit group of people who work together as a fleet to better each other as sailors. Across the country, and our fleet is no exception, the class is very welcoming and will support anyone who joins. Also, the J/24 is a boat that you can get involved with for minimal cost – to get in at the entry level."

The coveted Tonini Trophy is named after our famed and passed George Tonini who owned J/24 1031 *Trick or Treat*. Steph Helms, one of the legends of the J/24 fleet herself, said about George, "He was an active guy and an active member who just enjoyed the hell out of sailing. He was inspirational and was an all-around great guy. He made it fun and was a pretty damn good sailor who raced in every opportunity." The Tonini Series is won by the team with the best record over the

All levels of membership will receive updates about upcoming educational classes held by GMORA, races held as part of the Gulf of Maine Ocean Racing Circuit (GMORC), and a copy of Maine Yacht Racing (the official yearbook of GMORA).

Owner Membership: For the boat owner who needs to obtain or renew a PHRF certificate. Members will receive all the information and benefits listed above, plus a valid PHRF Certificate with ratings for racing and cruising divisions, and will be eligible for GMORC series awards.

Multihull Owner: A multihull owner who needs to renew or obtain a NEMA certificate. This member will get all the information and benefits listed above, a valid NEMA certificate providing a rating for racing events, and eligibility for GMORA awards. Go to www.nemasail.org and fill out the information requested for a NEMA certificate, and pay the NEMA membership dues, then go to www.gmora.org and pay the GMORA multihull membership dues of \$25.

Associate Membership: This membership is for crewmembers or boat owners who don't need a handicap. You will get all the information and benefits listed above, and will be eligible to vote on GMORA membership activities. As a member, you will also be eligible for election to a seat on the board of directors. Go to www.gmora.org to get your Associate Membership for just \$10.

2017 GMORA Grant and Sponsorship Program

Each year, GMORA awards a series of grants and sponsorships in an attempt to promote and support the sport of sailboat racing in Maine.

The mission of this grant program is to help our member organizing authorities (yacht clubs) promote and run better sailboat racing events. Applications will be chosen at the discretion of three sailors, one from each region appointed by the GMORA board with no direct ties to operation of any organizing authority.

This grant may only be used to purchase equipment (flags, marks, course board), or to pay for the direct operational cost of running a regatta (ie, Race Committee costs, gas, trophies) or to promote/advertise the event (posters, ads, swag).

A number of applications were considered in 2017, and \$2,500 in total was awarded to seven of these applicants:

\$500 to Handy Boat to help offset the cost of US Sailing-certified judges for the 2017 PHRF-New England's Regatta.

\$500 to Harraseeket Yacht Club to help offset rising regatta costs and keep entry fees low to encourage more participation at the Harraseeket Regatta.

\$500 to Centerboard Yacht Club to help refurbish their launch Ingalls, which acts as CYC's primary Race Committee boat.

\$500 to Boothbay Yacht Club to help support the creation of a new Junior Sailing Program building.

\$200 to Northport Yacht Club for use in their Junior Sailing School & Racing program.

\$150 to the MS-Regatta to cover the cost of Race Committee expenses.

\$150 to the Camden Yacht Club to help support their 2017 Camden Invitational Regatta.

Congratulations to all recipients, and thanks to all GMORA members for making these grants possible.
