Conditions of Eligibility, Scoring and Trophies

Eligibility

Each boat with a valid PHRF-NE or NEMA certificate whose owner is a current GMORA Regular Member in good standing shall be considered eligible for scoring.

Scoring

Race Day

A Race Day is one day of racing, whether one or more races are conducted. A competitor must start at least one race on a day for that Race Day to be eligible to be scored. If a boat scores DNC in all races on any day, that day will not be scored as a Race Day. Races with a defined course length of 100 nm or longer will be scored as two Race Days, even if the course is subsequently shortened by the race committee. A boat will earn Race Days and points based on the course that boat starts on, even if different divisions in the same regatta sail different courses, and even if some boats from the subject boat's GMORA division sail a different course.

Scoring System

Race Day performance of a yacht will be scored by GMORA using the CHIPS 3 scoring system, which weighs results by reference to the number of competitors in a particular division. So, for example, a first place in a division of 12 competitors will yield a higher score than a first place in a division of 5 competitors.

For the purpose of determining the season-long awards, CHIPS points will be awarded based on the number of competitors in the class who sailed in or designated the same GMORA division.

This means that if there are ten boats in a spinnaker-legal division, and two designate themselves as short-handed prior to the regatta, then the crewed boats will be scored as though there were eight boats in the regatta division, and the short-handed boats will be scored as though there were two boats in the division.

Division Breaks

For GMORA scoring PHRF-NE Racing Division breaks will be:
Division 1 – up to 93
Division 2 – 94 to 192
Division 3 – 193 and up

Cruising Class yachts that race on the same course shall be scored in one Division. If a regatta has more than one course for cruising class yachts, then yachts shall be scored against the yachts that raced the same course. In either case, the points earned will apply to the same year-end awards.

Multihull Class yachts shall be scored in one Division.

Shorthanded Class yachts shall be scored in one Division in regattas that offer one short-handed class. If a regatta recognizes more than one short-handed class, then short-handed yachts will be scored against the yachts that raced in the same class. In either case, the points earned will apply to the same year-end awards.

J/80 Class yachts shall be scored in one Division.

Member clubs are encouraged to use the same breaks where feasible.

Scoring

A Racing Class yacht shall be scored in her GMORA division irrespective of the division in which she races in any specific regatta. As an example: if a yacht has a Racing rating that places her in GMORA Racing Division 2, but the Race Committee places that boat in Racing Division 1 (for any reason), she shall earn points for each boat beaten that day, and those points shall be applied to her GMORA score against her Division 2 season competition.

Racing, Cruising, Multihull, and Shorthanded Classes shall be scored separately. Yachts that score a Race Day in one Class shall not apply that score to any other Class.

Standings for the day are determined by the low point scoring system, which is described in the Racing Rules. A yacht that is present and accounted for in the starting area but does not start a race will be scored DNS for that race will be considered to have competed and will be scored accordingly with a Low Point score of 1 plus the number of yachts. CHIPS 3 points for the day are awarded based on the resulting standings.

Regatta Results Submission Through Designated Portal

As a condition of scoring a regatta in the GMORA Season Series, organizing authorities must submit scoring information through the portal designated by GMORA for that purpose. For the 2022 season, that portal is Regattaman. The designation will remain the same unless or until GMORA announces a change in the designated portal. A change in designation shall be announced at or before the meeting at which the schedule is determined. The announcement shall be sufficient if broadcast through the GMORA email function.

Race Committee Support Credit

The purpose is to encourage yacht owners to support Race Committees by awarding GMORA points for Race Committee participation in GMORA-scored events. GMORA points will be awarded to a yacht whose owner provides support for a Race Committee. The following rules apply:

Race Committee support points will be awarded for at most two race days per season.

The owner must serve on the Race Committee for all races in each of the one or two race days.

To qualify for an award, a yacht must still race the required minimum number of race days.

Race Committee Points will be calculated as follows: Take that yacht's trophy-qualifying scores after throw-outs, drop the lowest one or two scores (depending on the number of days supporting the Race Committee in that region) and replace them with the average of the trophy-qualifying scores.

This calculation will apply to the Region, the Overall, and the Dirigo Bowl trophies. This will not apply to the Watson Trophy, the Ocean Planet Trophy, or other special awards.

Trophies & Awards

Awards are based on the Chips-3 scoring table (also known as high-point percentage scoring). With Chips-3 scoring, a vessel that wins in a larger fleet is rewarded more handsomely as

compared to a vessel that wins in a smaller fleet (refer to the Chips-3 table).

Regional Awards

Trophies will be awarded to eligible yachts in the three (3) GMORA Racing Divisions, the Cruising Division, and J/80 Class. Second and subsequent place trophies will be awarded if participation in the division is sufficient.

Western Region: To be eligible, a yacht must race at least four (4) Race Days in races designated for the Western Region (includes events labeled ALL) in the Race Schedule. Best four (4) Race Days count. Race Days must be from at least two different organizing authorities and at least four (4) separate events.

Boothbay Region: To be eligible, a yacht must race at least four (4) Race Days in races designated for the Boothbay Region (includes events labeled ALL) in the Racing Schedule. Best four (4) Race Days count. Race Days must be from at least two different organizing authorities and at least three (3) separate events.

PenBay Region: To be eligible, a yacht must race at least four (4) Race Days in races designated for the PenBay Region (includes events labeled ALL) in the Racing Schedule. Best four (4) Race Days count. Race Days must be from at least two different organizing authorities and at least four (4) separate events.

Eastern Region: In lieu of participating in the GMORA season series, GMORA makes an annual contribution to the Great Harbor Dream youth-sailing project.

If there is a region in which only one organizing authority properly submits scoring information to GMORA, then the requirement that a yacht race under two different organization authorities is eliminated for that region in that year. In that event, the yacht must have raced three (3) Race Days in that region (including events labeled ALL) to qualify for a regional award. This paragraph does not alter the requirements for any other award.

Gulf of Maine Overall Championships

To be eligible, a yacht must race at least five (5) Race Days, best five (5) Race Days count, and must be in events that are

hosted by at least two (2) different organizing authorities; see the Racing Schedule. For example, if a vessel sailed five (5) Race Days under the auspices of the Portland Yacht Club, she would still have to compete in at least one (1) Race Day under another organizing authority to qualify.

Multihull Circuit Championship

To be eligible, a multihull yacht must race four (4) Race Days in any GMORA sanctioned region. The best four (4) race days count.

Shorthanded Circuit Championship

GMORA will score a shorthanded circuit championship. To qualify for the shorthanded circuit championship, a yacht must race at least three (3) qualifying Race Days, including at least one race 45 nautical miles or longer; and must race all qualifying races with a crew of at most two (2). The best three (3) days count. At least one race, 45 nautical miles or longer, must be counted.

A qualifying race day is defined as follows: If there is a short-handed class, the yacht must race in that class, except as set forth below. The yacht would be scored against that class.

If there is a single-handed class but no double-handed class, then a double-handed boat may race in the crewed division in which she would normally race with a spinnaker. The single-handed yachts would be scored against the other single-handed yachts.

If there is no shorthanded class, then a shorthanded boat may race the crewed division in which she would normally race with a spinnaker. The yacht would be scored only against other shorthanded boats

If a regatta offers more than one shorthanded class for boats flying spinnakers, then yachts shall race in their respective assigned classes and earn points against those classes. Multihull yachts that meet these requirements are considered eligible. Cruising Class boats are not eligible.

When a shorthanded boat starts with another class, it is the responsibility of the owner/skipper to notify the GMORA scorer that said boat should be scored in the shorthanded standings.

The Dirigo Bowl, first awarded to Roger Hewson in 1974, represents a history lesson of sailing in the Gulf of Maine, linking the days of multiple overnight races to today's format of predominantly weekend day racing. The winners' plaques read like a who's who of racing in Maine.

The Dirigo Bowl started in 1974 under the auspices of the Casco Bay Sailing Association and was the season championship for CBSA. As CBSA dwindled and the Gulf of Maine Ocean Racing Association emerged, the Dirigo Bowl became the season championship for GMORA, representing all handicap racing in Maine.

Winning the Dirigo has never been easy. First, boats were required to sail outside their home area at least twice. Second, the races were closely contested, with the winner often determined in the last week or two of the season. In the 48 years since the first competition, there have been only 26 winning skippers, with one boat winning six times in seven years (*Kaos*, 2008-2014).

The trophy itself is impressive — a large silver bowl affixed to a varnished wood base with plaques identifying the winners. The silver bowl shows the scars of many winning celebrations of hearty toasts to the real and imagined feats of sailing and raucous partying. The Dirigo Bowl is not just about the past. There are future memories to be created and memorialized on the winner's plaques.

The winner in 2022 will have raced the best five days hosted by at least two (2) organizing authorities.

Come be part of the Gulf of Maine's sailing history. Don't be deterred by having to travel to another area. Make travel part of the fun. For example, if home is Casco Bay, cruise Penobscot Bay and Blue Hill Bay between the Max Warburg Trophy and the Around Islesboro Race. If you need to, leave your boat in Rockland for a few days on one of the town's many moorings. Imagine the memories you will have next winter.

Get off your mooring and come have some fun.

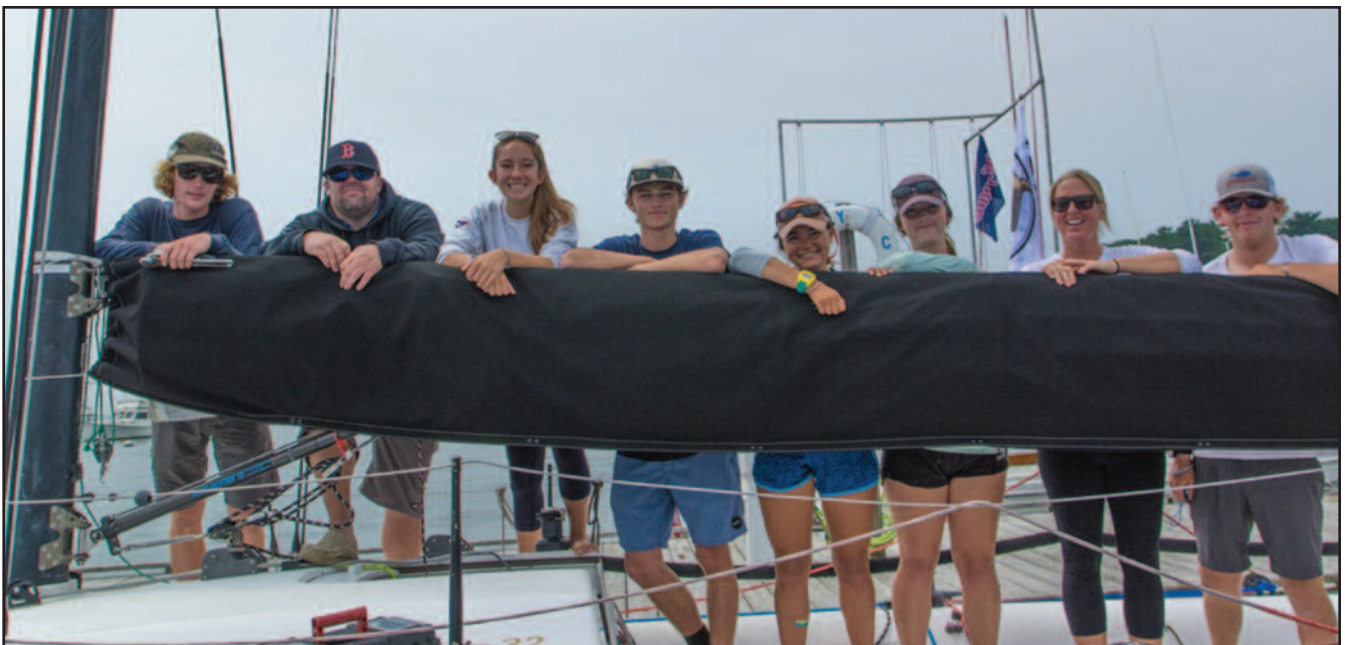

GMORA History

Following are some year-by-year highlights in GMORA history, compiled from information dug up from various offices, filing cabinets, and certain participants' remarkable memories. Anyone who can fill in any blanks is encouraged to send information to info@gmora.org.

1972 Nearly 60 members, 40 boats participated, 16 qualified for trophies, which were awarded Nov. 2 at the Port House Inn, Kennebunkport. Merle Hallett's *Scaramouche* was the season champion.

1973 The Pilot Race, Whaleback Race Div I and II, Monhegan Race IOR, Monhegan Race (New England Racing Rule), Manana Race, and Boon Island Race composed the series. A yacht needed to participate in at least three races to be eligible for a trophy. Thirty-eight boats were entered in the circuit, 21 received final point standings. The U.S. Coast Guard Academy's *Caper* took 1st overall.

1974 The Camden-Castine Race Weekend, Danforth Cup Race, Harraseeket Yacht Club, Kittery Point, Kollegewigwok, Castine and Camden, led to an expanded series. Twenty-nine GMORC yachts took part in seven races, and 22 qualified by competing in four or more races. For the first time, yachts were divided into two classes. Maine Maritime Academy's *Omega* won Class A, and Abbot Fletcher's *Majek* took 1st in Class B.

1975 Boothbay Harbor Regatta was included for the first time. There were eight races and 21 qualifiers for final standings. Albert Emanuel's *Kolibri* took 1st in IOR, Abbott Fletcher's *Majek* won NERR, Jan Pederson's *Heitoik II* was 1st in MORC. *Majek* was the overall season champion.

1976 A new divisional structure and handicapping system is introduced International Offshore Rule (IOR) and Midget Ocean Racing rule (MORC). There were still two divisions, and 26 boats qualified for final points. Doyle Marchant's *Revolution* won the IOR division. *Barbara*, skippered by Del Damboise, took 1st in MORC.

1977 Twenty-one boats qualified for final scoring. Merle Hallett's *Scaramouche* was 1st in IOR A, J. and Dave Corson's *Rub-a-Dub-Dub* won IOR B, Abbott Fletcher's *Majek* won the NERR division, and Payson Adams *Pointin Star* was tops in MORC.

1978 Danforth Cup and Whaleback Races were dropped from circuit. The Pilot Race changed to two-day race weekend, similar to Boothbay Regatta. Twenty-three boats qualified for final points. Doyle Marchant's *Revolution* and J. and Dave Corson's *Rub-a-Dub-Dub* won IOR A and B respectively. Abbott Fletcher in *Majek* took the NERR division, and Dave Cordeau's *Fast Company* emerged tops in MORC.

1979 Performance Handicap Racing Formula (PHRF) replaces NERR. Three divisions were created, one each for IOR, PHRF and MORC. Winners were Merle Hallett's *Scaramouche* in IOR and Del Damboise's *Barbara* in PHRF.

1980 Race Week was inaugurated. Twenty-five boats qualified for final scoring. Doyle Marchant's *Revolution* was the IOR division champion. PHRF Division A and B winners were Del Damboise's *Barbara* and Jan Pederson's *Heitorik II* respectively.

1981 The series was best of six races, including at least one overnight, and 31 boats qualified for final scoring. Winners were Fred Leighton's *Cadre* in IOR, Del Damboise's *Barbara* in PHRF, and Jim Stanley's *Capella* in the J/24 class.

1982 Measurement Handicap System (MHS) is included for the first time, and no IOR is included. Twenty-nine boats qualified for final scoring in the best of six races series. Merle Hallett's *Scaramouche* won PHRF Class A, Abbott Fletcher's *Majek* won PHRF Class B, and Fred Leighton's *Cadre* won the MHS division.

1983 Maine Cup team trophy added to Race Week. Thirty-two boats qualified for final scoring. Doyle Marchant's *Revolution* took 1st place in Class I; Del Damboise's *Barbara* won Class II; Peter Johansen's *Java* was tops in Class III; Tom Babbit's *Bravo* won the J/30 class; and Abbott Fletcher's *Majek* won in the MHS division.


1984 GMORA, formerly GMORC, is formed. Sixty-three boats qualified for season scoring. *Scaramouche*, *Majek*, and *Java* were the respective winners in PHRF Divisions A, B, and C; Jim Stanley's *Capella* won MHS A, and Abbott Fletcher's *Majek* won MHS B.

1985 Thirty-five yachts qualified for final scoring. Winners in their divisions were PHRF A *Airwaves*, Turner Porter; PHRF B *Scaramouche*, Merle Hallett; PHRF C *Majek*, Abbott Fletcher; PHRF D *Java*, D. Johansen; MHS *Capella*, Jim Stanley.

1986 Downeast Race to Mount Desert Island added. Sixty-one boats qualified for season scoring. *Capella*, *Scaramouche*, *Majek* and *Java* were the respective winners in PHRF divisions A, B, C, and D; the MHS winner was *Scaramouche*.

1987 International Measurement System, or IMS, replaced MHS. Season champions were as follows PHRF A *Widgeon*, Richard Levesque; PHRF B *Apex*, John Tarling; PHRF C *Jackpot*, Bob Twinem; PHRF D *Suivez Moi*, Bud Hawley; IMS *Sea Winds*, Myron Curtis.

1988 More than 40 boats qualified for season points. Merle Hallett's *Scaramouche* won PHRF I, Bob Kellogg's *Arbacia* won PHRF II, Abbott Fletcher's *Majek* won PHRF III, and Max Fletcher's *Naiad* won PHRF IV.

1989 Again, more than 40 boats were in the running for season points. Winners were Bill Reynolds' *Matriarch* in PHRF A, Geoff Emanuel's *Aberration* in PHRF B, Bob Twinem's *Jackpot* in PHRF C, and L. Nash's *Williwaw* in PHRF D. Doyle Marchant's *Revolution V* won the IMS division.

1991 Yarmouth Cup is added to the GMORA schedule for the first time.

1992 Maine Maritime Academy takes 1st in PHRF A in *Mariner*, Richard Levesque's *Tamarack* wins PHRF B, Ted McCarthy's *Equinox* is 1st in PHRF C, and Merle Hallett wins Cruising Class in *Scaramouche*.

1993 Maine Maritime Academy had a 1-2 finish in PHRF A with *Madcap* taking 1st and *Maritime Express* taking 2nd. Gary Blenkhorn's *Illusion* and Bob Kellogg's *Tamarack* take 1st in PHRF B and C respectively. *Avatar*, skippered by Alan Kew, wins Cruising Class. David Boas of *Madcap* wins the Dirigo Bowl, which recognizes the overall champion who gets the most points in its nine best races days, while racing at least two days outside its home area.

1994 *Abracadabra*, skippered by Jon Knowles, wins PHRF A; Scott Harris' *Haymaker* is 1st in PHRF B; Ted McCarty's *Equinox* wins PHRF C; Chris Robinson's *Houqua* is the Cruising Class champion. Scott Harris of *Haymaker* wins the Dirigo Bowl.

1995 Dick Hale and his crew on *Bandito* win PHRF A, Dan Wellehan's *Shamrock* takes PHRF B, Bob Kellogg's *Tamarack* wins PHRF C, and Wayne Smith in *Defiant* wins Cruising Class. Dick Hale wins the Dirigo Bowl.

1996 Downeast Race Week is started. Seguin Island Trophy Race joins the GMORA schedule when the Boothbay Region Boatyard joins with Southport Yacht Club as a sponsor. This is the first blue-water race sponsored by SYC since 1985.

1997 Hospice Regatta of Maine is launched and included in the GMORA schedule. Bob Johnstone in *Gannett* wins PHRF A; the Altercation Syndicate wins PHRF B in *Altercation*, Ted McCarthy takes 1st in PHRF C in *Equinox*, Chris Robinson wins Cruising Class in *Houqua*, and Peter Garcia's *Alegria* wins the Multihull Series.

1998 PHRF Maine Championship is created and added to the GMORA schedule. Bill Helming's *Still Crazy* wins PHRF A, *Altercation* wins PHRF B, and Winton Scott's *Symmetry* is first in PHRF C. *Trinity* wins the Multihull Series. *Altercation* wins the Dirigo Bowl.

1999 Dick Hale's *Bandito* wins PHRF A, Byron Borst's *Synergy* is 1st in PHRF B, and Ted McCarthy's *Equinox* wins PHRF C. The Dirigo Bowl goes to *Equinox*.

2001 Dick Hale and the crew of *Bandito* are again triumphant in PHRF A. The Maine Maritime Academy's *Madcap* wins PHRF B, and Richard Hallett's *Family Wagon* ends the season at the top of PHRF C. *Madcap* wins the Dirigo Bowl.

2002 *Bandito* is again the PHRF A champion, Ned Semonite's *Black Owl* wins PHRF B, and Butch Minson wins PHRF C in *Cat's Paw*. *Faamu Saami* wins the Multihull division.

2003 *Bandito* again wins PHRF A, Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* is 1st in PHRF B, Jon Randall takes PHRF C in *Snowbird*, Don Logan's *Keemah* takes 1st for the J/105s, and Randy Rice's *Rita P* wins Cruising Class. Dick Hale takes home the Dirigo Bowl for his great season with *Bandito*.

2004 Maine Maritime Academy's *Sheerness* edges out *Bandito* for 1st in PHRF A, Sash Spencer's youthful crew in *Whiplash* wins PHRF B, Geoff Emanuel's *Commotion* wins PHRF C, Randy Rice's *Rita P* wins Cruising Class again, and Peter Garcia's *Alegria* is first in the Multihull division. The Dirigo Bowl goes to Maine Maritime Academy's *Sheerness*.

2005 Sash Spencer's *Whiplash* wins PHRF A, Ned Semonite's *Black Owl* takes PHRF B/J105, Geoff Emanuel wins PHRF C in *Commotion*, Mark Werner's *Nipantuck* wins Cruising Class, and *Faamu Saami* was tops for Multihulls. *Nipantuck*'s Mark Werner wins the Dirigo Bowl.

2006 *Revolution II*, skippered by Ed Rogers, wins PHRF A; Richard Hallett's *The Wagon* is the PHRF B winner; Richard Stevenson's *Roach Coach* took 1st in PHRF C; *Five*, skippered by Tom Hall and Graciela Lamy, won PHRF D; and Mark Werner's *Nipantuck* won Cruising Class. *Nipantuck* is a repeat winner of the Dirigo Bowl, just edging out *Revolution II*.

2007 GMORA introduces the Arthur K Watson Memorial Trophy, awarded to the yacht that scores the most points throughout the season. In its

first year, the trophy goes to *Kaos*. Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* takes 1st in PHRF A. *Keemah*, skippered by Don Logan, is 1st in PHRF B. John Randall's *Snowbird* wins PHRF C. Mark Werner's *Nipantuck* wins Cruising Class. *Nipantuck* scores a "three-peat," taking the Dirigo Bowl back to Southport for the third year in a row.

2008 Dick Hale's *Bandito* wins Racing Division 1. Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* takes 1st in Racing Division 2. Graciela Lamy's *Seven* wins Racing Division 3. *Pit Party*, skippered by Rich Ketchum and Steve Fernald, emerges at the top of Racing Division 4. Greggus and Jennifer Yahr's *C-C-Courage* takes 1st place in Cruising Class. Merle Hallett's *Scaramouche* wins the Arthur K Watson Memorial Trophy. *Kaos*, skillfully sailed by Scott Smithwick and his outstanding crew, is winner of the Dirigo Bowl.

2009 GMORA teamed up with SailMaine to launch the first annual SailMaine Regatta. Funds raised through entry fees and product sales benefited the SailMaine community sailing program in Portland, which offers sailing instruction and coaching to youth, high-school teams, and adults. Pete Price's *Big Dog Party* won Division 1; Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* took first in Division 2; *Tamarack*, skippered by Bob Kellogg, took top honors overall in Division 3; *Pit Party*, co-captained by Rich Ketchum and Steve Fernald, was 1st overall in Division 4; Randy Rice's *Rita P* took 1st overall for Cruising Class. Scott Smithwick and *Kaos* scored a repeat, winning the Dirigo Bowl for the second straight year.

2010 GMORA introduced the *Ocean Planet* Shorthanded Racing Trophy to recognize excellence among singlehanded and doublehanded racers. The winner would be the yacht with the best six race days, two of which had to be sailed in a race with a distance of 50 miles or greater. Bruce Schwab, skipper of the Open 60 *Ocean Planet* that competed in the Around Alone Race, donated an artifact from the original *Ocean Planet* to serve as a perpetual trophy. Butch Minson, skipper of *Cat's Paw*, was the first winner of the trophy.

The PHRF Maine Regatta moved to the Boothbay area, as Boothbay Harbor and Southport Yacht Clubs teamed up

to host a two-weekend series of races.

At year's end, Pete Price's *Big Dog Party* emerged at the top of Division 1 overall, Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* won Division 2, Butch Minson in *Cat's Paw* took Division 3, Rob Hawley won Division 4 in *Rainier*, and Randy Rice's *Rita P* was tops in Cruising Class.

Scott Smithwick and his crew on *Kaos* won the Dirigo Bowl for a third straight year, edging out Don Logan's *Keemah* by just a few points.

2011 The racing schedule was revamped in an effort to ease delivery logistics and encourage more boats to participate. Following the Fourth of July weekend, the action moved straight to Penobscot Bay, where the Rockland Yacht Club stepped up to the plate and hosted a "revival edition" of a favorite point-to-point race to Castine and back. Racers competed the following weekend off Camden, and then boats harbor-hopped their way back west, with stops at Boothbay and Southport before the big Monhegan overnighter.

Scott Smithwick and his talented crew aboard *Kaos* were once again dominant, winning the Dirigo Bowl for a fourth consecutive year. *Big Dog Party*, skippered by Pete Price, won Division 1; *Kaos* emerged atop Division 2; Butch Minson's *Cat's Paw* was 1st overall in Division 3; and Randy Rice's *Rita P* won Cruising Class.

2012 The Penobscot Bay Rendezvous was added to the circuit and proved very popular. The inaugural running of the Gulf of Maine Solo-Twin race from Provincetown to Rockland was a hit with single- and double-handed racers.


Don Logan's *Keemah*, Peter Price's *Big Dog Party*, and Richard Stevenson's *Buzz* battled it out all summer for the Dirigo Bowl, with *Keemah* emerging as the victor at the end after the Portland Yacht Club's Fall Series was done. Overall division winners were *Big Dog Party* in Division 1, *Keemah* in Division 2, and in the Cruising Division, Randy Rice came in first in the new-to-him

2013 Scott Smithwick and crew on board *Kaos* once again schooled the fleet taking home the Dirigo Bowl, for the fifth time in six years, but not without some drama in September. At the end of August, *Kaos* lead *Keemah* for the overall by 11.1 points, and proceeded to extend her lead after the first Fall Series race. However, the next week, in the Lightship Race, *Keemah* beat *Kaos* to cut into *Kaos'* lead, but not by enough. The die was cast.

Overall division winners were Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* in Division 2 and Butch Minson's *Cat's Paw* in Division 3. There were no overall winners in Divisions 1, 4 or Cruising. Scott Miller's *Resolute* won the *Ocean Planet* Shorthanded Trophy.

2014 Scott Smithwick won the Dirigo Bowl for the sixth time in seven years. Congratulations are definitely in order for Scott's dominance on the racecourse. Scott Miller won the Ocean Planet Trophy, and Richard Parent took home the Arthur K. Watson Memorial Trophy.

The Overall division winners were Scott Smithwick's *Kaos* in Division 2, Rich Ketchum's *Pit Party* in Division 4, Marc Lorraine's *Hightail* in Cruising and Scott Miller's *Resolute* in Shorthanded. There were no Overall winners in Divisions 1 and 3.

2015 Congratulations are in order for Ryan and Michelle Raber and their well-honed crew in their first season on the new *Scapa* as they held off Scott Smithwick and *Kaos* to win the Dirigo Bowl. The Overall winners were *Scapa* in Division 2 and Butch Minson on *Cat's Paw* in Division 3. There were no Overall winners in Divisions 1, 4 and Cruising.

Points East, for the first time, awarded the Yachtsman of the Year to the Double Handed team of Scott Miller and Gregg Carville for their accomplishments on Scott Miller's *J/122 Resolute* in the Bermuda 1-2, the Marblehead to Halifax Race and the Fastnet Race.

Once again, the format change to a cocktail party for the fall Awards evening was a big hit as just under 100 sailors gather for the festivities at the Centerboard Yacht Club on the shores of Portland Harbor.

2016 The Northport Yacht Club's Around Islesboro Race was added to the circuit and proved very popular drawing a fleet of 53 boats spanning ratings from 30 to 273 and included entrants from as far away as Casco Bay. *Cat's Paw* held off last year's winner *Scapa* by a very slim margin to win the Dirigo Bowl. The Overall winners were Ryan Raber on *Scapa* in Division 2, Butch Minson on *Cat's Paw* in Division 3, and Jonathan Green on *Jereboam* in the Shorthanded Division.

Points East awarded the Yachtsman of the Year to Richard Hallett for his many years of racing accomplishments and helping many sailors with advice and encouragement in their growth as sailors. The format of a cocktail

party for the fall Awards evening was again a big hit, with just under 100 sailors gathering for the festivities at the Centerboard Yacht Club on the shores of Portland Harbor.

2017 An almost entirely new executive board was elected, comprised of sailors from the next generation. The number of Race Days was reduced to 4 for regional trophies and 7 for the Dirigo Bowl to encourage more participation. An Educational Series was created by Lauryn Smith and taught by Butch Minson, with nine classes held between Centerboard Yacht Club and Front Street Shipyard, teaching the basics of sail trim, tactics and racing rules. Cruising Class in Casco Bay saw tremendous double-digit gains in participation, the kind not seen in recent history. The Dirigo Bowl was won by Kenneth Weg and the crew of *Ranger*.

2018 *Fiddler's Green*, a classic cruising boat, was awarded the prestigious Dirigo Cup. *Fiddler's Green* was the first cruising boat to earn the cup in over a decade, since *Nipantuck's* three-year reign from 2005-2007. In 2018, GMORA grant committee awarded \$2,500 in grant funds to six sailing organizations.

2019 Under the leadership of President Brent Sullivan, membership and PHRF certificates issued rose to the highest level in almost 10 years. In conjunction with the membership growth, Cruise class participation continued to be quite strong. Congratulations to *Ranger*, skippered by Ken Weg, on winning the Dirigo Bowl for the second time in three years.

2020 Given the outlook in May 2020, the season (the year of the virus, masks and social distancing) was successful thanks to Maine's lower case load versus many other states, and Maine's sailors drive to do what was necessary to get out on the water safely. By eliminating shore-side gatherings before and after racing and following the guidelines for masks and social distancing, the fleet sailed almost all of the racing schedule (2 regattas were cancelled and 1 was reduced to a 1 day event). PenBay, Boothbay and Northeast Harbor started on time while Casco Bay delayed the June weekend races to July. At the end of the season Ken Weg and crew on *Ranger* took home their third Dirigo Bowl in 4 years. Congratulations!

2021 was a year for the record books. After a sharp drop in membership in 2020, 2021 came storming back, posting a modern-day record of 204 members with at least one PHRF certificate issued to 199 boats. While the weather didn't always cooperate, the growth in members and boats resulted in more boats on the starting line, with the Cruising class experiencing the greatest growth. Much to the relief of everyone, the onshore social activities returned cautiously but returned, nevertheless. *Ranger* and crew captured the Dirigo bowl for the 4th time in 5 years. The competition was tight, with *Ranger* claiming the title by less than a point on the last day of the season. Congratulations to Ken Weg and his outstanding crew.

J/80 Circuit Championship

To be eligible, a yacht must race in all the combined fleet events designated to count towards the J/80 Maine Circuit Trophy (See race schedule). The lowest score after all counted regattas will determine the winner. Events designated to count shall be decided by J/80 Fleet 14-Maine before racing begins for the season.

Perpetual Trophies

Dirigo Bowl, Gulf of Maine Championship

The winner shall be the yacht that attains the highest score for the best five (5) Race Days hosted by at least two (2) organizing authorities.

Arthur K. Watson Memorial Trophy

It is awarded to the yacht that participates in the most GMORA sanctioned Events. In the event of a tie, the trophy will

be awarded to the yacht that has the highest cumulative Race Day CHIPS 3 points.

There is no distinction granted to specific Division participation. Yachts in all Divisions, both Racing, and Cruising, are eligible.

Eligibility is recognized even when a yacht participates in more than one Division. Yacht scores from all Divisions will be added together to be cumulative.

Events are Series recognized and sanctioned by GMORA.

Ocean Planet Shorthanded Racing Trophy

Awarded to the first-place winner of the Shorthanded Circuit Championship.

CHIPS 3 Scoring Table

This table gives the points awarded to each boat at the end of each day of racing. Notice that each column has one more than the number of boats. The last number indicates the points awarded for DNF. For example, in the first column (for just one boat), the upper number is the points awarded if the boat finishes, and the lower number if the boat does not finish.

A few good reasons to race your cruising boat

There are about 40 boats that actively campaign in the GMORA racing series; dozens of others participate in a few selected events. But there are many, many other sailboats on the Maine coast that don't come out to the line at all. Some of them rarely leave their moorings.

When asked why they don't come out and race, some skippers will say they don't have the time; others say they lack crew; still others feel their "cruising" boat doesn't stand a chance against the race rockets with all the whistles and bells.

But the truth is nearly anyone can get out there and, with a little effort, be competitive. Even if you don't take home any silver, racing is a great way to meet fellow sailors and have a great time out on the water.

It's time to bust some of the common myths about sailboat racing.

Myth #1: *My cruising boat wasn't designed for racing. Her displacement is heavier, she doesn't point as high, and she doesn't have the sail area as some of those race boats.*

You stand a better chance than you might think. All boats competing in GMORA races are assigned a handicap based on factors like their design, displacement, rigging, and sail area. The lower the rating, the faster the boat. So if your boat rates 141, the fastest competitor in your class has a rating of 108, and the race committee is using time-on-distance scoring (the most commonly used in the Gulf of Maine), that "faster" boat will owe you 33 seconds per mile. That means on a 10-mile course, she would have to cross the line five minutes, 30 seconds ahead of you to beat you on corrected time.

PHRF New England even has a recreational credit for boats with roller furling and a limited sail inventory. So what you might lack in go-fast equipment, you get back in a rating credit.

Myth #2: *You need a huge inventory of high-tech sails to be competitive.*

Not necessarily. As mentioned above, PHRF New England offers a recreational credit for boats with above-deck roller furling and a limited inventory of Mylar or Dacron sails. And if you don't have a spinnaker, you can race Cruising Class - it's a great option for first-time racers as well as racers who would like to kick back a notch.

Myth #3: *It costs a fortune to get a boat race ready and keep it that way.*

The incremental cost of racing over cruising doesn't have to be that much. While some skippers spare no expense to get the latest and greatest equipment and sails, others can be reasonably competitive without breaking the bank.

Boat owners already spend a fair amount every year on necessities like bottom paint, hauling, launch and storage. Some of the most important performance enhancements - like a smooth bottom and minimizing weight on board - can be achieved cost-effectively by doing the work yourself. Think of the extra boatyard time sanding the bottom as an opportunity to bond with your fellow boat owners.

Myth #4: *Racing involves a lot of complicated rules. It seems like you need to be a lawyer to understand them all.*

While the rulebook might look a bit intimidating at first glance, knowledge of 10 basic rules will get you through most situations you'll encounter on the course.

Myth #5: *You need a lot of crew to race, and finding crew is difficult.*

First, depending on what kind of boat you have and what class you race, you might not need many people. Some cruising class boats, which don't fly spinnakers, race with just two or three people on board.

Second, if you want to fly a chute and need more people, finding crew is a lot easier now than it used to be. The annual Points East crew match party is a good place to start. It's happening Wednesday, May 4, at Handy Boat in Falmouth. Cruising sailors are already familiar with this annual rite of spring. So this year, in addition to enjoying the free refreshments, find yourself some crew.

You shouldn't miss the party, but if you do, Points East magazine also has an online crew-match section where you can post and search. There is also the world-wide web. GMORA hosts a crew-pool forum on its website, www.gmora.org. Sailing Anarchy's crew-pool forum can be found at www.sailinganarchy.com.

You can also post notices at local yacht clubs and boatyards, or check with the yacht clubs' youth-sailing programs. Some of the participants in these programs are working toward landing spots on college sailing teams. They have a lot to offer a racing program, and by making them part of your team, you'd be helping them gain valuable experience.

Myth #6: *Racing skippers have a reputation for yelling a lot.*

Most of the stories about highly competitive skippers with a reputation for shouting at their own crews and other skippers are gross exaggerations and should be taken with grain of salt. While there are occasionally anxious moments at the starting line, more often than not, the conversation both on and off the course is friendly. After the race, it's not at all uncommon for a winning skipper to buy a competitor a beer and give pointers on making the boat go faster. To put it simply: Racers in all classes want more people to come out and play and perform at their best.

I've saved my favorite myth for last.

Myth #7: *I'm really not that competitive - I couldn't care less whether I'm going faster than that other guy.*

Come on, you're not fooling anyone. It has been said that whenever two sailboats are within sight of each other and going in the same direction, they are racing. Some die-hard cruisers might fervently deny that, but even the most laid-back skippers who claim not to give a whit about racing have been caught putting forth some effort to make their boat go faster.

Many a "cruising" skipper has been spotted looking over his shoulder at another boat and them trimming sails to try and gain some ground. So as long as you're going through all the motions of racing, why not make it official?

If you're still not convinced, consider this. The camaraderie among racing sailors is what keeps them hooked. Sailboat racing has been described as a subculture where people from diverse careers and backgrounds share a common interest, and where competitive drive is tempered with sportsmanship.

Want more motivation? Skills developed on the race course come in handy on that summer cruise. Better boat speed means you'll get to your destination earlier, or, if the mood strikes, you can click off more miles and get to places you haven't visited before.

So even if you think you're a die hard cruiser, consider giving racing a try. There's little to lose and a lot to gain, and the friendships can't be beat.
